The Global Fund Advocates Network Asia-Pacific (GFAN AP) is an advocacy platform of HIV, Tuberculosis and malaria community and civil society in the Asia-Pacific region. GFAN AP supports advocacy for a fully resourced Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (Global Fund), increased and sustainable domestic resource mobilisation for health, and equitable, people-centred, human rights-based and gender-transformative inclusion of HIV, TB and malaria responses within Universal Health Coverage (UHC).

VISION

All people in the Asia-Pacific living with, affected by and/or vulnerable to HIV, TB and malaria can access quality and equitable health care and services as part of Universal Health Coverage.

MISSION

Supporting the coordination, convening, and mobilisation of community and civil society organisations **to advocate for a fully resourced Global Fund** that ensures access to quality and equitable healthcare as part of Universal Health Coverage for all people – living with, and affected by, and/or vulnerable to HIV, TB and malaria.
